

WELCOME TO THE QUEENS CHAPEL CIVIC ASSOCIATION

The Queens Chapel Civic Association (QCCA) welcomes you to the Queens Chapel Community either as a new or longtime resident. We appreciate you becoming a new or returning member of the civic association.

The QCCA was established in 1964, incorporated in 1966 and is a long-time member of the DC Federation of Civic Associations.

QCCA represents the civic and public interests of the Queens Chapel Community in various ways that include working with the ANC, Office of the Mayor, Office of the Ward 5 Councilmember, city agencies to include the Department of Buildings, Department of Licensing and Consumer Affairs, Department of Public Works, Department of Transportation, Metropolitan Police Department, Office on Aging and Washington Area Sewer Authority as examples.

Monthly meetings are held on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 pm by **zoom** from November through March. The zoom link is sent by email to the QCCA List Serv. **In-person** meetings in April, May, June, September, and October are held at Union Wesley AME Zion Church.

Annual civic dues are **\$20.00** per household. Dues help defray the costs of (1) weeding, planting, and mulching the area around the signs to the three entrances to the community (16th and Gallatin, Michigan and Eastern Avenues and Webster and South Dakota), (2) the area around the memorial to the late Reverend David Turner (16th Street), (3) maintaining a yearly post office box at the Brookland Station, (4) maintaining the QCCA website (qcca.org), (5) publishing the Civic Seer newsletter, and (6) providing cards and stamps to mail cards to neighbors for get well, thinking of you, condolence, and a new birth. A small monetary contribution is included for condolence and a new birth.

(7) A donation is also made at Thanksgiving to the Capital Food Bank and (8) at Christmas to the Hospital for Sick Children, Dr. Bears Closet. (9) QCCA awards a \$1,000 scholarship in June to eligible Queens Chapel students.
